

MAY FLOWERS off a half beat the slowest, got guided over to the rail, rode it to past midpoint on the turn, was put to brisk urging and proceeded to get angled outward a few strides from the five-sixteenths marker, wound up in the six path a furlong down the road, closed in readily on the front runners, drew even with the runner up with about a sixteenth remaining, cemented itself to the front shortly afterwards and kicked cllear. SWAGGY three wide, contensted the pace as the widest of a threesome, was under encouragement turning for home after having secured the advantage by a bare margin, shook free of each nemesis after an addition furlong only to get pounced upon by the eventual winner, had that opponent draw even at the sixteenth pole, gave up the lead after a few more jumps, forged onward to be second best. SUDESTADA took up the chase from the two path on the turn, swung outward until five wide by three-sixteenths pole, drifted in a couple of paths departing the eighth pole, altered course after a strong left handed shot in the final seventy yards, bobbled then resumed his run to grab the show. HARDCORE vied with vigor for the lead from between rivlas, was set down heading home, continue to battle from the middle of others to midlane then weakened. NEILINGER used leaving the starting gate, failed to achieve a prominent spot, was switched over to a fiirm hold afterwards by the pilot, tracked the sparring front runners from along the rail angled three wide entering the stretch, failed to fire appreciably. CHARIS was on the track first, having been excused from the post parade, broke without apparent mishap, tucked along the rail, slipped into the two path heading for the top of the lane, moved along down the lane lacking optimal clearance, and would remain that way the rest of the journey to the finish line, was caught momentarily by the now-weakening BLAME DIXIE with slightly under a furlong to go, showed interest the only time really asked to do so, this occurring after a solitary right handed shot splitting rivals in the final seventy yards. SCAMPER rated in the three path stalking a hotly-contested pace, spun from the same path into the stretch, called upon for some run, failed to respond. BLAME DIXIE was sent over to the inside, argued for control with a pair of foes pinned onto it, positioned out in paths two and three, fell back slightly even after some hand urging approaching the quarter pole, stayed in contention for a little while longer before faltering.
