GASLAMP stalked the pace four wide, loomed a danger, was no match for the winner, but churned on to hold the place. L T'S BEST TALE was allowed to settle, tucked in to save ground, took closer order into the lane, altered course to the outside for the final furlong to find clear sailing, and finished well once uncovered. MAGIC FIVE tracked the pace off of the inside, bid three wide, but flattened between horses. KINGS KNIGHT was allowed to settle, came four wide and was making up ground. CURLINS PRIDE attended the pace off of the inside, bid between rivals, steadied from tight quarters near the furlong maker and faltered. SHAMBALA opened clear to set the pace, was collared entering the stretch and gave way readily once headed. R M MONEY TALKS contended along the inside, was put in tight a furlong from home, steadied and showed little thereafter. BATTLEBACK JOHN was close up four wide to the second turn and stopped.
