LOU went four then three wide on the first turn, tracked the pace on the outside, made a bid in the two path on the far turn, edged clear under a left-handed whip in upper stretch, switched to a right-handed whip at the sixteenth-pole, shifted in after switching leads at that point, hit the rail then was straightened by the rider and was hand ridden to the wire clearly best. SIRALEN went three wide on the first turn, was reserved on the outside, came under urging while three to four wide on the far turn, was put to the whip while outside in upper stretch, pursued the leader into the final sixteenth and proved no match then was eased up late while safely securing the place. LOPE settled while off the inside, went two to three wide on the far turn, came under a left-handed whip in upper stretch, raced between horses into the final furlong and lacked the needed kick while able to get the show. WORLD PEACE set the pace on the inside, was asked coming to the quarter-pole, came off the rail into the stretch, battled with the winner under the whip, dropped back at the furlong marker and gave way. BLUE RIBBON GIRL settled on the inside, moved a bit closer at the half-mile pole, was roused on the far turn, cut the corner into the stretch, was given one crack of the whip while behind horses near the three-sixteenths, continued behind horses until the furlong marker, moved out at that point and lacked the needed response.
